Campers will take part in fur trading, pioneer games, colonial St. Louis, riverboats, and the Old Courthouse. Journey to the top of the Arch and get a behind-the-scenes look at westward expansion, area settlers, historical hiking trails and much more!

1863 AND ME: THE CIVIL WAR EXPERIENCE

Ages 5-13. Campers will experience an exciting week of what life was like in 1863, during the Civil War. In partnership with the U.S. National Park Service and the Ulysses S. Grant National Historic Site, campers learn about not only the Civil War but all that was connected to that era: railroads, Grants Farm, White Haven Farm, Father Dickson's Cemetery, hiking the Grant Trail, reenactments of the Civil War and the nation's longest operating Armed Services location at Jefferson Barracks.

ROLLIN' ON THE RIVER

Ages 5-13. Explore two of the greatest rivers in the world right here in St. Louis! In partnership with National Great Rivers Museum, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, The Audubon Center at Riverlands, and National Audubon Society, campers will explore the actual locks & dams on the rivers, drive a simulated barge, ride a ferry, hike the Mississippi River Trail, learn water safety and environmental stewardship, and discover how the confluence of the two rivers creates the heart of one of North America's great migratory flyways.

June 15-19

BEYOND THE CONCRETE

Ages 5-13. This exciting week will provide campers with a love and appreciation for everything outdoors through experiences at local parks and conservation areas! Campers get to fish, hike, and gain orienteering and mapping skills. Campers also will learn nature survival skills, identify trees, trails, habitats, cook in the great outdoors and explore both urban and rural trails.
